## Getting to Know Your New Lawn



### Zoysia

Medium to low once established

## CARING FOR YOUR ZOYSIA LAWN



### SPRING

#### Maintenance

In early spring, rake up any debris. Use **Scotts® WeedEx™ Prevent with Halts®** if needed. Four weeks later, follow with **Scotts® Turf Builder® Weed & Feed** for a lush, green lawn. Fill in bare spots with **Harmony® sod**, available by the piece at your home improvement center.

#### Watering

Water ½-1" once a week only if it's a dry, hot spring. Water if you notice a dark, bluish-gray color, foot printing, wilted, folded or curled leaves.

#### Mowing

Mow at 1-1 ½".



### SUMMER

#### Maintenance

In early summer, feed with **Scotts® Turf Builder® Southern Lawn Food** to strengthen the lawn, helping it withstand heat and drought conditions. It slow-releases nutrients, making it the go-to fertilizer for all grass types.

#### Watering

Water 1-1 ¼" once a week, early in the morning. Sandy soils, require more frequent watering about ½" every third day. A dark, bluish-gray color, foot printing, and wilted, folded or curled leaves indicate it's time to water.

#### Mowing

Mow at 1 ½". Mow lawn in partial shade areas at 2-2 ½".



### FALL/WINTER

#### Maintenance

In cooler weather, use a slow-release fertilizer like **Scotts® Turf Builder® WinterGuard® Fall Lawn Food**, to strengthen the lawn's roots. It feeds the lawn consistently and is better for the environment.

#### Watering

Follow summer irrigation guidelines. Dormant lawn may still need to be watered in dry, warm weather. Newly planted sod should be watered.

#### Mowing

Mow at 2" when nighttime temperatures drop below 70 degrees.
